**15.10-15.40** **GDPR implementation at national level**

After the adoption of the General Data Protection Regulation last year, member states together with national and European authorities are starting to draft and amend legislation to be ready on 25 May 2018, when the regulation will become applicable. Germany is at the forefront of this process and many other countries are looking at the outcome of the "German experiment" to decide how to deal with the implementation. In this session, Serena Holm will present the main features of the German Federal Data Protection Act that has been proposed in Germany and the questions it raises. Other questions the session will raise include:

- How are other member states dealing with the GDPR implementation?
- What are the main concerns for CRAs in relation to the GDPR implementation?
- How is the "German experiment" perceived at EU level and by other member states (positively, negatively, as an example to follow, ...)?

### PRACTICAL INFORMATION

#### Useful addresses:

**Event location & Hotel:** | K + K Hotel Opera | Budapest, Révay u. 24, 1065 Hungary

#### How to get there:

**By plane.** The distance to Airport Budapest Ferihegy is 24 km. The estimated travel time by taxi is 35 minutes. There is also an Airport Shuttle Bus available directly from the airport to the hotel. The booking desk is located in the arrivals hall.

**By train.** The closest train station is Nyugati pályaudvar (Train Station „West“), located 3 km from the hotel. By public transport, take metro line M3 (blue line) to "Deák Ferenc Square", then change to M1 (yellow line). The hotel is located at the stop "Opera".

**By car.** Secure parking is available in the hotel garage. At the end of highway M7 or M1 follow the sign "Centrum". Take Petőfi híd (Petőfi bridge) across the Danube to the Pest side. Continue to Oktogon square. There you have to turn right and then immediately left onto Andrásy utca. Turn right into Káldy Gyula utca (second street past the Opera House to the right) and right again into Révay utca.

#### Evening Programme:

The cruise on the Danube will start at 19.00. In order to get there in time, participants are requested to gather in front of the hotel at 18.30. BISZ kindly arranged the transportation by taxi from the hotel to the dock (and back).

During the dinner, the boat will set sail for a short trip (approximately 2 hours) on the river Danube in Budapest, during which participants will be able to appreciate the magnificent night view of the city from the river.
